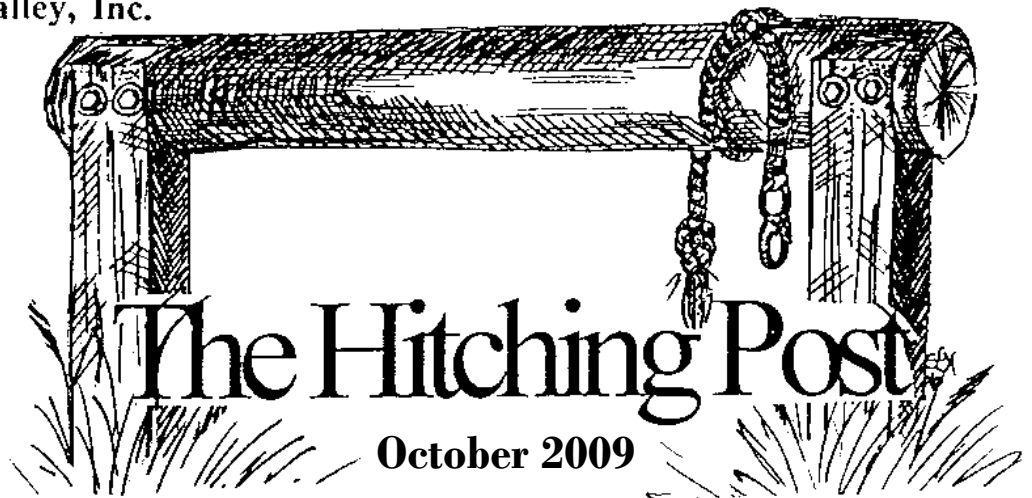
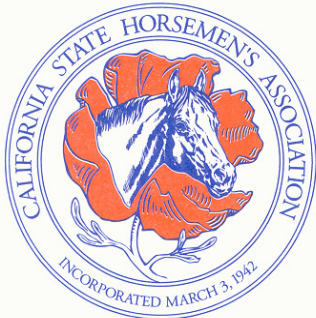

September Membership Meeting - Dana Rochat demonstrated (photo attached) and presented the rules for the Sporthorse/Hunter In Hand class that will be offered in the TS 2010 Horse Show Series. The horse is first set up in an open position and then walks the horse outside of the smaller triangle of cones, and then trots outside the larger triangle of cones. Plain leather halter (no silver) is required for junior horses, horses over 3 yrs must be shown in an English bridle. The handler wears a conservative shirt with a collar, such as a polo shirt, pants are loose dress pants, such as khakis (no jeans), shoes are running shoes or paddock boots (no western boots). Showing on the triangle is a fun class and a great way to show off your nice moving performance horse.

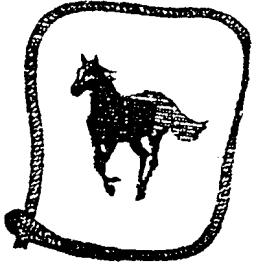
