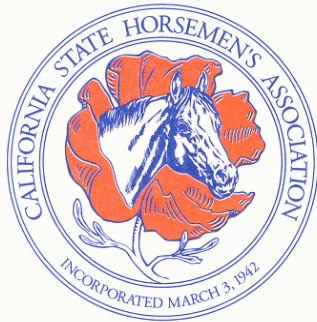

Interesting Factoid of the Month:

As you dismount and rub your weary rear after a long trail ride, you may feel like you've ridden at least a thousand miles, but you can get a more realistic idea of the distance traveled by multiplying the average gait speed by the time spent in the saddle.

A pokey walk is about 2 miles per hour (mph), while a 'working' walk is about 3 mph.

A regular trot covers roughly seven miles in an hour's time, while a 'big' trot extends the distance to about 10 miles.

A slow lope or canter clocks in at about 5 mph, and a 'working' canter at about 9 mph.

A fast canter or gallop for the average horse is 15 mph. At that speed you'll be up off the saddle, feeling like you're racing the wind, but it's nothing compared to a racehorse's 35 mph speed.





August 12, 2008

1. Call to Order – President Marcia Narog called the meeting to order at 6:20 p.m.
2. Roll Call – Margie Breitkreuz, Sue Gilchrist, Barbara Kezar, and Barbara McCarthy-Kimbell attending.
3. Correspondence & Announcements – Membership renewals received, port-o-let bill.
4. Approval of Minutes – Margie motioned, Barbara Kezar seconded, approved.
5. Treasurer's Report
 - 5.1. Margie provided a detailed report – summary: checking ending balance of \$3,184.47, savings balance of \$15,207.46 - total \$18,491.93. Margie also provided a separate accounting for the Show proceeds - \$1,899.35, and expenses, \$534.00, ending balance \$5,807.07.
